Camperships

Campership Forms Due: May 1, 2020

The purpose of the Juniata Valley Council, BSA Campership Fund is to provide assistance to Scouts, who would otherwise not be able to afford the cost of attending a Juniata Valley Council Summer Camping program.

These applications are confidential and are reviewed by a volunteer committee. Consideration will be given to those whose units participate in the Annual Friends of Scouting Campaign, Fall Popcorn Sale and whether the Scout participates in any supplemental fundraising opportunities to help him raise funds for camp.

A typical campership may be up to fifty-percent (50%) of the discounted camp fee. In exchange for the campership, the Scout may be asked to provide some service to the council or camp and write a thank-you note to a contributor.

The Campership Fund is available only to Scouts registered in the Juniata Valley Council who are attending a Juniata Valley Council Scout Camp.

Pre-camp Leader's and Parents Meeting	June 1, 2021
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- The person in charge of day camp from each pack is asked to attend the Pre-camp Leader's meeting, Requested copies from parents are to be submitted at this meeting.
- Tuesday June 1, 1021 At Del-Delight Legion Park in Hollidaysburg. The Pre-camp meeting will be held at 6:00 pm in the Pavilion #3.
- Parents are encouraged to attend also.
- At this meeting we will go over any last minute changes that you the leaders and parents will need to know prior to your arrival at camp.
- Remember: this is the time to turn in all of your paperwork in advance to help speed up the registration process when you check-in.
- Covid-19 discussion will be on the agenda.

2-Deep Leadership	Patrols
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- 2 Adults from your Pack must accompany every 8 youth participating.

Patrols:

- The Pack's Patrol will consist of your units Tiger, Wolf, and Bear Dens.
- Webelos and Arrow of Lights Dens will be together in a patrol. Plan accordingly with 2-Deep Leadership for this patrol too.

Please plan accordingly if you the Parent are attending and you have participants in both patrols.

- Tiger, Wolf and Bear Cub Scouts are not permitted to join the Webelos and Arrow of Light Patrols. Or vice versa.
- Webelos and AOL Patrols will be working on completing requirements and electives from the Webelos Handbook.
- Tiger, Wolf and Bears will be working on requirements and electives from their handbooks

We take our responsibility for the welfare of youth entrusted in our care very seriously. For that reason, policies have been established which pertain to the control of No visitors on camp property. The release of youth from camp, and verification of no-shows at camp. Policies are summarized below and will be covered in greater detail at the pre-camp leader's and parents meeting. Pa Clearances

ALL adults attending the day camp program must have Criminal Background Checks/Clearances as required by PA Act 15.

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Covid-19

All County, State, Federal and BSA Covid-19 implemented restrictions, guidelines, policies and plans in place at the time of our event will be followed.

At this time:

- **Masks are required!**
- **Temperatures will be checked at camp during morning check-in daily.**
- **Scouts and Adults will be sent home if they have a fever (See next section)**

Temperature Checks Every Morning Before Leaving for Camp

- **Temperatures must be checked before leaving your Pack's home town.**
- **Anyone with a fever of 100.1 degrees or over must remain at home.**
- **Packs are required to provide masks, and hand sanitizer, for their participants and Adults and Leaders.**

Arrival at Camp

Daily check-in: 8:00 am - 8:30am

Additional information will be available at the Pre-Camp Meeting.

Parking

Please park in designated parking areas. Additional information will be available at the June 1st meeting.

Dress Code:

Wear Day Camp T-Shirt Daily

- **2021 Official Cub Scout Day Camp T-shirt. Wear every day!**
- **No open toe shoes, sandals or crocs permitted at Day Camp..**
- **Short-Shorts not permitted at Day Camp.**
- **Masks will be required.**

Drop Off / Late Arrivals

Early Departure

After Camp Pick-up area

Please note changes!

Drop-off 7:50am-8:15am :

Late Arrivals:

- Check Temperatures at home!
- Keep Scout home if Temperature above 100.1 degrees.
- Park in the Temporary Drop-Off and Pick-up Area . Wear a mask.
- You must walk with your Scout to the Dining Hall and stay until their temperature is checked and a person from your pack is there to hand-off your scout too! (See Covid-19 Temperature)

Early departure:

- Please send a detailed note of time and name of person who will be picking up your scout.
- Follow posted signs,
- Park in Temporary Drop-Off/Pick-up Area.
- Report to Camp Office at Dining Hall. Wear Facemask.
- Show photo ID.
- Wait at the Dining Hall Office for the Staff to bring the Scout to you!

After Camp Pick-up area

- Park in a designated area. Wear Facemask.
- Bring a Photo ID to the Dining Hall Office to pick up your scout.

First Aid, Medication & Medical Officer

- During daily check-in the Medical Officer will conduct screenings as needed.
- While on the Day Camp Course the Medical Officer will be assessing Scouts, Adults, Leaders, Siblings and Staff for their safety and dehydration. The stations and trails will be assessed for hazards, weather hazards, and concerns and he/she will confer with the Key 3.
- CPR/First Aid procedures will be followed. Medical Officers will delineate what is treated at camp and how and when EMS/Ambulance is to be used.
- Campers with limitations, special needs, or life threatening conditions will be made known to the appropriate camp staff after check in daily.
- Life Saving medications; including Epi Pens, inhalers and heart medications should be carried and administered by the responsible Adult/Parent/Guardian or responsible scout.
- Locked Freezer and/or Locked Refrigeration is available at Office/First-Aid for Medication.

Injury or medical check

First Aid Office is at Memorial Lodge

- Report injury to adult staff at station ASAP.
- Adult staff will call for a Medical Officer.
- If serious, do not move the injured. Staff will call for Medical Staff.
- If you take the injured to the First-aid office, please tell adult staff at that station

Weather

“Weather is one thing we cannot control”

- Camp will continue in light rain.

In the event of extreme weather, camp may be dismissed early.

- All packs will be dismissed from the Dining Hall Office.
- Dismissal will be after a complete camp attendance is taken, and all scouts are accounted for. Do Not just leave.
- All measures of safety will be enforced before scouts may proceed to transportation.

Thunder-Lightning, Emergency, Fire, Fire Drill:

- Staff will alert participants of severe weather watches and warnings.
- A Horn will sound 3 short blasts and repeat... Please follow staff instructions!
- Patrols will report to the dining hall area and staff will take attendance.
- Please await instructions from Camp Director and Camp Advisor.

Sun and Temperature:

- Mornings are cool, afternoons are hot!

Buddy System

Familiarize your Scouts and refresh yourselves on how the Buddy System works.

- ❖ Always use the Buddy System!

Lost Persons:

- Report the lost persons to Adult Station Staff immediately, Don't wait!
- Adult Staff at the station will alert Key 3. Camp Director will then alert the other station Staff to begin searching..
- A Horn will sound 3 short blasts and repeat.

- Staff will tell Patrols to report to Flag Field.
- Patrols will report to Flag Field and wait for attendance and instructions.
- Staff will begin searching for lost immediately from their station to the last known location of lost. Searching will continue until lost is found.

Day Camp Staff Volunteers

- We are Scouts and Scouters from the Troops and Packs in the Chief Logan District and Juniata Valley Council.
 - Adults from our community are volunteers too.
 - All adult staff have submitted Medicals, Youth Protection Training, and Pa Clearances.
 - Adult staff will be in charge of the station they are assigned.
 - Adult Staff will be in communication with Key 3 and Medical Staff at all times during camp.
 - Shooting Sports Staff have completed the requirements for Range Master.
- To join our staff see Sandy, Kristen or Andrew.**

Things to bring to Day Camp:

- Small backpack
- Water bottle
- Money for Council Trading Post The Trading Post will offer Drinks, Snacks, Scout items.
- Bug Repellent
- Morning Healthy Snacks
- Lunch (No refrigeration available) Afternoon Healthy Snacks

Kitchen: Details will be addressed and available at June 1st meeting concerning purchasing meals from the kitchen at Camp Anderson

Suggestions, items to bring to camp

- Sunscreen
- Chapstick
- Bug spray
- Raincoat or poncho (Check daily weather)
- Gatorade type drinks.

Smoking, Vaping and E-Cigarettes:

- Smoking, Vaping, E-Cigarettes are only permitted in designated areas.
- Keep Out of sight and smell of our scouts!

Electronics: Tablets, Ipods, phones etc...

- Do not send electronics with your scouts.
- Chief Logan District and Juniata Valley Council are not responsible for lost, stolen, wet, broken or damaged items.
- Leaders will have their phones.
