Arrival and Check-In:

- Will provide four (4) dedicated merit badge sessions however if Scouts come prepared to camp with additional completed merit badge worksheets as independent study work from a provided list of options, Counselors will be available during open programming periods to review work and approve
- Full merit badge daily schedule and list of independent study merit badge options to be released in May when class signups are made available online

Afternoon Open Programming

- Monday Thursday from 4:00 5:30pm

Boating Programming

- Will offer options for canoeing, kayaking, and rowing during regular merit badge programming sessions from Monday to Thursday from 9:00am 4:00pm
- If the lake at Seven Mountains Scout Camp is unavailable due to repairing the dam, plans have been made to utilize Poe Valley State Park and shuttle Scouts to/from with packed lunches provided
- Final details to be released in May but a commitment has been made by the JVC Camping Committee to provide boating merit badges in 2024

Backpacking on the Mid-State Trail

- A two (2) day, one (1) night excursion on Monday and Tuesday
- Gear checks will be done prior to departure
- Depart directly from camp and utilize the nearby Mid-State Trail
- Each backpacking group will consist of a maximum of 12 participants; total number of groups to be finalized in May based on interest levels
- Will cover partial requirements for hiking, backpacking and camping merit badges while on the trail
- Participants will have trail meals for Monday's lunch/dinner and Tuesday's breakfast/lunch
- Will return to camp by Tuesday evening for the rest of the week's programming

Additional Programming Offered at Seven Mountains

Netami Program: open to 1st & 2nd year Scouts

- Will meet Monday Thursday mornings to work on rank advancements, Totin' Chip and Firem'n Chit
- Netami Scouts will be organized into smaller patrol-sized groups and rotate through eight stations with each session lasting approx. one (1) hour each
 - Stations to include: Scouting 101, Knots & Lashing, Axe Yard & Firemaking, First Aid, Maps & Orienteering, Camp Cooking & Cleaning, Plant & Animal ID, Outdoor Ethics & Leave No Trace
- Afternoons will be reserved for merit badge sessions
 - One session is reserved for Swimming merit badge and will also cover related rank requirements
 - The other merit badge session will be a Scout's choice
- Will have working lunches on Tuesday and Thursday for a nature hike and orienteering course
- Wednesday's lunch will offer a 1st Time Shooting Experience at the range that will be open to all interested Scouts who have never used a .22 rifle before
- Physical fitness rank requirements can also be covered in Early Riser morning sessions if interested

Additional Activities

- Early Risers Challenge:
 - Monday Thursday mornings from 7:00 7:30am
 - Option for Scouts and Leaders to do lap swimming, polar bear swims, fitness exercises and trail runs
 - Will provide fitness testing if needed (i.e. pushups, sit-ups, sit n' reach, mile run)
- Evening Indoor Game options
 - Board Games, Card Games, Minute-to-Win-It style games
- Night Shoot and Stargazing
 - Scheduled for Monday & Thursday evenings but dependent on weather forecasts

Friday Programming

- **Scout Skills Challenges:** patrol games and activities to challenge the skills of individuals and patrols at various program areas (Aquatics, Shooting Sports, Nature, Scoutcraft, Skilled Trades, STEM)
- **Scout-led E-Prep Training Drill:** Scouts will lead a practice emergency drill to complete requirements for safety-related merit badges; time can also be used for make-ups on other merit badges if needed
- Scout Relay Race Challenge: team building relay race and obstacle course
- Closing Ceremony: goal is to end by 8:30pm in case any units plan to depart on Friday evening
 - Scout-led songs, skits and cheers; family members are welcome to attend
 - Recognition for individuals and patrols for Program Area accomplishments, Scout Skills Challenges and Scout Relay Race Challenge
